



TEACHING:
**The Times They Are
 A-Changin'**

For 25 years I have had the great privilege of leading over 500 conferences in 32 states and 12 countries (several places on multiple occasions). As I come into a new city/country I usually ask the Lord, "What are You doing in this place? What's going on here?" When He answers, I try to tailor the nature of the event to take those things into consideration. When I return to the same place the question is "What are You doing here now?"

I don't consider myself a very astute observer of the world scene, but even someone as average as I can notice some patterns and dynamics. As we prepare to enter a new year, I want to share some of this with you.

Dissatisfaction. People are tiring of business as usual. This goes beyond the current economic difficulties, international conflicts, and the like. We were created for an intense relationship with the God of the universe, but that has become normalized into a pattern that is proving to be inadequate. You can see this in the youth. Thousands of young people have given up on church but not on Christ. They are flocking to demanding lifestyles such as the International House of Prayer where they spend many hours a week in prayer. In addition there are millions of true believers who don't bother going to church anymore. One respondent to a questionnaire after a recent FreshWind event said: "Having had much exposure to the charismatic movement in the 70's, it was a delight for me to see the Spirit fall on so many people imparting the weight and wonder only the Spirit

can give. I heard so many people say things like 'why haven't I heard about this before?' or 'Why isn't this being preached in our church?'" I think this means that we need to get back to the Biblical basics and live them out with intentional vigor.

Shift of center of Christianity. It is clear that Christianity's vigor has shifted from the West to the Developing world. There we see astounding church growth, we see miracles and other evidences of the Spirit's power, we see persecution, and we see vitality that is wonderful to behold. By the way, these people are not simplistic: there are more bishops in the Anglican developing world with earned doctorates than in the US. These people are not inferior in intelligence. They have learned that the faith is real because they have lived it and seen its benefits, unlike many in the West. Its been said many times that we need the mission field more than it needs us. When we go on missions we benefit from their amazing vigor. God's point in that, I think, is that we bring that vigor back home and share it here.

Hunger. More and more, people who want to be serious about the Gospel are getting hungry to experience the things the Gospel says are available to believers. Healing the sick, affecting the weather, enjoying divine provision, controlling the demonic—these are meant to be the norm.

Determination. I see it in some pastors; I see it in the youth; I see it in church members who know there is more to be experienced. Determination is rising up and it is producing those behaviors that will allow the Lord to respond to them. Pastors have given up competing with each other for new members and are gathering together to come into deep unity as they plead with the Lord for their communities.

Committed believers are realizing that the ministry belongs to them as much as to the clergy. "Train us and deploy us!" is being heard more often. By-passing infrastructure is becoming more common. We're realizing that we don't have to have buildings, budgets, committees, and congresses to do God's work. Committed believers can gather together, listen to the Lord, and step out in radical dependence on Him to effect real change.

In September I did a conference for an alive church on Sullivan's Island, SC. A little before the event I recommended that their worship team learn Misty Edwards' song "You won't Relent." They ended up doing it 3 times during the conference. It became the rallying cry. Look at the words:

You won't relent
 Until You have it all
 My heart is Yours

I'll set You as a seal upon my heart
 As a seal upon my arm
 For there is love that is as strong as death
 Jealousy demanding as the grave
 And many waters cannot quench this love

Come be the fire inside of me
 Come be the flame upon my heart
 Come be the fire inside of me
 Until You and I are one

Hearing the song as Misty does it is very powerful. My point: God's determination awaits ours.

Sacrifice. To get radical about God takes sacrifice. Sacrifice and vigor just go together. I would encourage you to count the cost, as Jesus recommended. But having counted the cost, I would encourage you to pay it. Every cost I have paid has ended up in benefits that have far outweighed the price. (By the way: are you on unemployment? Make sure you tithe on your unemployment check and any other money that comes in. That's the fastest way to let God get you a new job.)

Now don't make me convince you about faith being willful; I've done that in several books and countless talks. It's Nike time, folks: JUST DO IT! Don't wait until you feel it or think it's a good idea.

There's much more to be said about the current times. But I encourage you to dwell on the above matters and see if you come to a point of action.

A Challenging Prayer:

Help me to spread your fragrance wherever I go.
Flood my soul with your spirit and life.
Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly that all my life may only be a

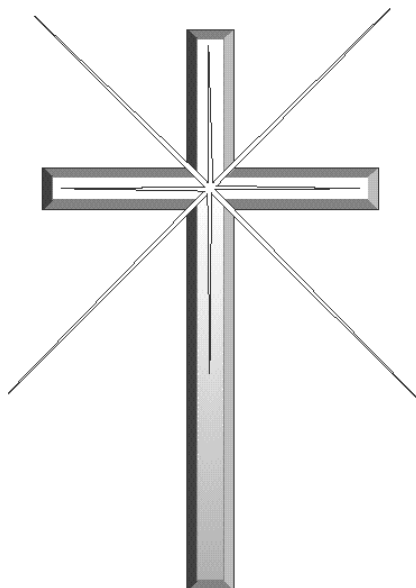
